"They are pretty cold but they are OK," he said. "They were all pretty hungry."

No one needed hospitalization.

The other three teens involved were Joe Mish Jr., 15; Jason Weingoz, 15, and Cassandra Phelps, 16.

All four teens are recuperating in a private condo near Powder **Mountain**.

Crews searched the base of the 40-foot-wide, 10-inch deep **avalanche** looking for possible victims but found none.

Malan said rescuers were unable to search for the teens Friday night because of heavy snow, dark and cold that would have endangered crews.
